# **Accomplishments**

- Annual garden summit held on Feb 18th, 80+ attendees.
- Awarded a total of \$2,000 in garden enhancement grants to 4 gardens.
- Facilitated leadership training and development at **17** community gardens.
- Held lease and liability insurance for **13** gardens on City of Madison land.
- Administered Madison Water Utility billing for **11** gardens.
- Consulted **8** new garden projects on public and private land.
- Advocated for equitable land use contracts between gardeners and private land owners.
- Identified administrative needs and developed best practices and tools for project management.
- Advocated for access to resources that meet basic human needs and support sustainable growing practices.
- Collaborated with private land owners, county government agencies, land trusts, community organizations, City of Madison Parks and Engineering Departments, Madison Water Utility, Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District, and the Department of Transportation.
- Advocated for policy changes (i.e. temporary land use permit, affordable water access, and gardens as an official park use).
